21C STRONGLY SUPPORTS HOUSE ENERGY AND COMMERCE SUBCOMMITTEE PASSAGE OF THE "TROL ACT" AS A BALANCED SOLUTION TO STOP BAD FAITH PATENT DEMAND LETTERS
